A "Normal" Week at SJB

At SJB we like to keep a healthy structure and routine for everyone. This means that our school days and our school weeks are nice and predictable, allowing new students to settle quickly and stay organised.

When you arrive in school in the morning, you will go to your form room where you will line up outside and be met by your Form Tutor. You will spend the first 25 minutes of each day together as a group; this is an opportunity to meet with your friends and get ready for the day ahead. We start our days with prayer where everyone listens and reflects respectfully. There is time for your tutor to read out any important messages. Sometimes you will be asked to bring in a book to do some silent reading.

Every other week, on Mondays, we have Key Stage assembly in the Main Hall. After registration, all the students sit quietly on chairs and listen to Mr Granville Hamshar, or a member of staff, lead our reflection and prayer centred around the theme of the week.

We also have a Year Assembly on Fridays, where we explore themes important to our year group such as friendship, kindness, and feelings. This is also a time when we reward the students and share some of the exciting things that the year group have been up to.

After form, we set off for lessons. This means moving between classrooms – there are 6 lessons every day! There will be teachers in the corridors during lesson changeover and a one-way system which makes the journey to your next lesson a bit easier.

If you get lost please do not panic, you can ask anyone, and they will show you the way! You can also start to familiarise yourself with what the SJB site looks like by watching Mrs Alder's video later!

At break time and lunch time you will be allowed to go into the playground where you can talk to your friends. Some students bring a football or basketball into school so that they can play on the field or courts. There are also table tennis tables by the sports hall for you to use.

From Easter to October half term you can go onto the field. Some students also choose to sit inside the Year 7 indoor area with friends; this is a quiet space where you can socialise with friends.

Break times and lunchtimes are also when most students visit the bathroom or head to their locker to get organised. You can also go to the Fast Supper Canteen in the Main Hall or the Snack Shack in the playground to buy tasty snacks, school dinners and drinks.

At the end of the day you will be dismissed from your last lesson. Most students then head straight home on foot. Some walk straight home, many get the coaches and a small number are picked up by car; we ask that parents pick you up by car in the leisure centre car park so that we can be mindful of student safety, congestion and our neighbours.

On the days when you have PE you will need to bring your PE kit into school with you.

If you have a locker you might decide to leave it in there for a few weeks at a time, but do not forget to take it home each week to wash! Lockers are managed by an external company, Parents can hire one through our 6 into 7 portal on the SJB website.

School Lunches

School lunches are eaten in the

'Fast Supper' at the back of the main
school hall. Students line up outside and
wait patiently to be served.

We have lots of choice in the Fast Supper from soups to salads; sandwiches to wraps; pasta to hot meals and noodles Our fantastic Innovate team cater for lots of dietary requirements.

We also have hot snacks served to go from our playground **Snack Shack**. We pay for our lunch using our biometric data from our fingerprint, which is scanned when you are at the check-out (parents this debits your family **ScoPay** account so it's important to make sure it is topped up weekly).

After choosing and paying for their lunch in the canteen, student then take their food on a tray to find a table to sit down and eat their food. The canteen is a happy place where we enjoy our food and chat to our friends. If you bring a packed lunch, you can also choose to eat it in the canteen or outside at one of the picnic tables. Your friends with hot meals can then join you!

Some students choose to eat their hot dinner or



packed lunch in the playground, and many enjoy sitting in our outside covered area as it is a little quieter and there is more space. Here the tables are round and students can often been seen talking or playing games like uno. It is another buzzing, fun area to meet new friends!

After eating we always take our rubbish and plates to the catering station for recycling or washing. We take pride in being independent at SJB and looking after our school together.



For students wanting a quieter place to spend their lunch time there is the HUB where you can read your book, the huge playground to explore or why not drop by Mrs Alder's office and say hello!

Arbor

Arbor is the portal that we use to facilitate communication between staff, parents, and students. Here are some examples of what Arbor will allow you and your parents to see:

- The nominations and House Points awarded for your effort and achievement.
- View your fortnightly timetable
- View homework that has been set by a teacher online
- Sign up to extracurricular activities

You will be given your login and details on how to access it during the first week of September. Do not worry there will be someone to help you if you get stuck!

Parents you will be able to access the app independently on your own devices. Students you will start your year with computer access and your paper planner until you receive your SJB iPad which is typically after half term.

Homework

We believe that homework should be both purposeful and enjoyable – we do not want you spending time completing tasks all evening when you could be out having fun after school! However, we also believe it is important to support you in establishing good working habits outside school so that you can be best prepared for the additional work required as you move further up the school.

You will receive 40 minutes each night in Year 7. You will have a homework timetable to help guide you on which subjects to complete on which days.

All homework is set on Arbor during class. This task then becomes visible on your parents app. It is important to check it every day after school to see what is due the next day! It is very important to write the homework instructions down clearly so that you remember what to do later – it is your responsibility! If you have missed some instructions or you do not really understand what the task is, you should ask the teacher directly or via email to explain it. This might take time, so it's always best to complete homework when set and not to leave it until the night before!

Never go home worrying about homework, always find your form tutor, or your teacher. There is always someone willing to help at SJB.

Homework club runs daily 3:30-4:30pm in the Hub. There is always an adult and everyone is welcome with no need to sign up.







iPads for Learning & responsible use of technology

All students have iPads and love using them each lesson. Your iPad will give you access to your timetable and to Arbor. It is important you bring your iPad to school fully charged every day. You are responsible for keeping your iPad; the best way to do this is to keep it in its protective case. iPads must be kept in the plain black case at all times for insurance purposes and put it into your locker during break and lunch. You are not allowed to use your iPad in the corridors between lessons. But, at break time and lunch time you can use you can use them, but we encourage all year 7s to play and socialise rather than use their iPads.

You will be able to get technical advice from the technicians who are in the middle corridor.

Phones are not allowed on site at SJB for students in KS3 and KS4.

Your phone should be switched off and in your bag during the school day.



Extra-Curricular Clubs

At SJB there are a wide variety of clubs that you can join. These take place mainly during lunch time or after school. The extracurricular timetable will be provided in September and communicated via Arbor. Students will be able to sign up to activities in September.

Lots of students look forward to joining clubs and making new friends, here is a list of activities that we hope to be running in Autumn for Year 7, although there may be some changes to these:

Houses are paired into four colours and work towards the coveted House Trophy at the end of the year.

Every student will be in one of our eight houses and will compete in a variety of House Competitions to gain points. You can earn points for your house by being awarded house points. You can get these in a number of different ways including participating in big events like SJB Bake Off; participating in extra curricular clubs; attending school every day; achieving excellent monitoring grades; and receiving nominations and House Points in class.



Student Rewards

The Student SJB 7 was devised by our current students. It is made up of ten learning behaviours they felt were important to encourage, recognise and reward:

- 1. Positive attitude
- 2. Participate fully
- 3. Creative and curious
- 4. Collaborate with others
- 5. Try your best to improve
- 6. Challenge yourself , don't give up
- 7. Think for yourself, be Independent

At SJB we recognise and reward students' effort and attitude to learning through nominations. Parents and students receive push notifications from Arbor when their child is awarded a nomination. All nominations are worth 5 house points. You can also earn House Points in lessons from going above and beyond expectations.

'Star badges' are awarded fortnightly across the school. Come top of the category to wear your badge with pride on your blazer.

The Learning Support Department




