	<p>Do you want to find out how to code instructions to activate an LED, turn a motor, or publish something online? Then come along and get hands on.</p>
	<p>Athletics takes place on Tuesday and Thursday after school and is open to all year groups.</p>
	<p>Badminton will be on Thursday afterschool and is open to all years.</p>
	<p>KS3 book club is an exciting opportunity to explore and enjoy a variety of books. You will have the chance to read both as a group and independently, and you will be practicing your oracy skills in order to discuss thoughts and feelings about plot, characters and themes.</p>
	<p>As part of Business club you will take part in the Roy Castle Lung Cancer Foundation 50/50 enterprise scheme. This is one of the school's chosen charities, and some of the profit from your enterprises will be donated to this charity. Throughout the year there are opportunities for you to sell at school events such as SJB day and the Christmas Fair and many students start their own website and/or sell to friends and family. This is a great club for any budding entrepreneurs out there who want to get experience in starting and running their own business. You can join and run your club as an individual or get some friends together and run it as a team - it is up to you. The only requirement is that you donate some of your profits to the charity.</p>
	<p>Cheerleading is on Thursday afterschool and is open to all year groups. The club will involve creating a cheer routine including stunts, tumblers and dancing!</p>

	<p>Chess is one of the oldest games in the world. It teaches strategic thinking, logic and it's fun too! This club is open to Years 7-9 and welcomes beginners as well as players who have experience. An outside specialist will run the club, allowing students to play friendly games of chess against their peers during lunchtime.</p>
	<p>The Scenario: SJB has a covert training centre for would-be spies (SJB Office of State Security (SJBOSS)); recruited to help make the world a better, safer place in which to thrive. Under the guise of the SJB Maths Club, volunteers for 'Spyschool' are guided through the : basics of Cryptography: creating and analysing codes.</p> <p>Meanwhile, SJB has received intelligence that 'enemy' agents are plotting to distribute fake 'Platinum Anniversary Souvenirs' in an attempt to discredit both the Royal Family and the government and to add to the current national depression. The NSEA (National Schools Equestrian Association) is an organisation who hold inter school equestrian competitions for a range of abilities and disciplines.</p> <p>We are looking for students who ride regularly and own or have access to a horse to be able to compete in team and/or individual competitions. Our students will be given the opportunity to compete at a level suited to them in show jumping, dressage or cross country. Most of these competitions are based locally within Surrey, Sussex and Hampshire. Competitions vary in date and will be available on the school calendar once the new academic competition dates have been announced. Through joining the SJB equestrian team our students and parents will be able to choose which dates and locations best suit them, without feeling obliged to enter every competition.</p>
